## **MESSAGES FROM ELECTED OFFICIALS**

#### A Message From SENATOR DONOVAN M. DELA CRUZ

Aloha,

What a difference 2 years has made!

The COVID-19 global health pandemic produced significant shifts in multiple sectors of Hawaii's economy, of which the Legislature has worked diligently to address. We are now observing an attempt to return to normalcy. As a result of a State budget surplus, several persistent socio-economic issues are being addressed such as Hawaii's housing shortage and competitive pay for teachers and healthcare workers. We are also witnessing the historical fulfillment of a century old promise to build and award homestead lots for those of Native Hawaiian ancestry, along with the opportunity to support Iolani Palace and the Bishop Museum, the stewards of Hawaii's cultural treasures, and targeted repairs and maintenance of school campuses and government facilities across the State.

The most impactful bill to be introduced and passed on the House and Senate floor this session, is State Budget Bill HB1600. Working with the twenty State Department Heads, the Ways and Means Committee Staff and Chair Sylvia Luke of the House Finance Committee, we drafted a bill that reflects the highest and most urgent needs of the State. Restoring funding for lower and higher education was a priority for the Legislature. Both the Department of Education and the University of Hawaii made significant budget sacrifices during the pandemic while continuing to serve our students. The restoration of their budgets ensures that key services continue. We also made major investments in critical safety net programs such as expanding post-partum care from 2 months to 12 months for Medicaid patients, providing dental benefits for Medicaid patients, and establishing a state match for Temporary Assistance For Needy Families (TANF) and Temporary Assistance For Other Needy Families (TAONF) rental subsidies. As a result of the large surplus, the Legislature made commitments to fund harbor and trail repairs, grants for accelerators and small businesses, the planning and design of a new Aloha Stadium Entertainment District, the establishment of new law enforcement agencies to combat white collar crime and human and sex trafficking, and issue a one-time tax rebate to taxpayers.

Through SB3048, there was an allocation of \$300 Million to the Hawaii Housing and Finance Development Corporation (HHFDC) for the development of much needed affordable housing

units across the State. HB2511 appropriates \$600 Million to the Department of Hawaiian Homelands (DHHL) for the building of thousands of homes for those of Native Hawaiian Ancestry, funds will go towards lot development, infrastructure, and down payment assistance. The Kalima Settlement in SB3041, saw an allocation of \$328 Million in the resolution of multiple outstanding lawsuits by waitlisted Hawaiian Homeland beneficiaries that have not been awarded homesteads as mandated by law. This legislative session also provided the opportunity to mend the social safety net with the passing of SB514, providing the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) for working class families, and padding their tax returns with a \$100 or \$300 rebate per person based upon household size and income level.

Legislators in both the House and Senate worked to further solidify the social protections for the middle class with the passing of HB2510, which incrementally raises the minimum wage to \$18 by the year 2028, and makes the EITC a refundable and permanent fixture of Hawaii's tax code. Recipients of Ohana Zones services and accommodations can expect to receive extensions of emergency sheltering services of up to a 90-day period upon request, through the passing of HB2512. In this bill, \$15 Million has been allocated to extend the pilot program addressing individuals and families without permanent housing options and extends the sunset date to the year 2026. Another major accomplishment in this session seeks to address the recent surge in catalytic converter theft across the island of Oahu.

Finally, I am pleased to announce that the Mililani Complex is receiving funding for projects that improve school facilities at various campuses. Working closely with Senator Michelle Kidani, we were able to secure \$2 million to improve the softball field and \$9.3 million for a career and technical education facility at Mililani High School. Lastly, Mililani Ike Elementary was appropriated \$200,000 to replace aging playground equipment.

It is a privilege to represent you in the Senate, and I am pleased to share these important development projects that further highlight the hard work and numerous accomplishments and progress attained for our communities during this historic 2022 Legislative Session. I greatly appreciate your support as I continue to work towards positively shaping the future of the State of Hawaii, leading meaningful social cohesion, and promoting policies that enable strong resilient families and communities. The work completed at the State Legislature is not possible without your continued help and support. Mahalo!

#### A Message From SENATOR MICHELLE KIDANI


Aloha Mililani Community,

As this legislative session comes to a close, I wanted to take a moment to mahalo my constituents for allowing me to represent them in the Senate. As Senate Vice-President and Chair of the Education Committee, I am honored to continue representing District 18 to make positive changes for our community and our State. This year, thanks to a robust rebound in our economy, the Legislature passed bills that will benefit generations of working families for years to come. Here are a few highlights of the bills passed this session:

- SB2184: RELATING TO DIGITAL LEARNING appropriates over \$7,000,000 to provide digital learning opportunities for students in the next school
- SB2821: RELATING TO MENSTRUAL EQUITY ensure that students in every public school will have safe access to menstrual products. No child should continue to miss school because they cannot afford appropriate products to manage their menstruation.
- HB2510: RELATING TO INCOME Making the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) refundable and permanent. Also, increasing the minimum wage to \$18/hour by 2028
- SB514: RELATING TO THE GENERAL FUND: provides a tax refund of \$300 for individuals making less than \$100,000 a year or \$100 for those making more than \$100,000 a year.

Of the many Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) that were passed this session, I am proud to share that, with the help of Senator Dela Cruz, I managed to secure over \$23,000,000 for much-needed improvements to various Mililani educational facilities. These improvements will be incredibly impactful for students, faculty and staff. These projects include: the design and construction of a covered playcourt for Kipapa Elementary, building expansion for Mililani High administration building, design construction and equipment for a Career and Technical Education (CTE) facility for Mililani High, ADA improvements for public accommodations at Mililani Uka Elementary, and the renovation and expansion of the cafeteria at Mililani Waena Flementary.

As the school year came to a close, I had several opportunities to join colleagues, students and faculty at several important events, one of which was the completion of Mililani Middle School's new



classroom building. Mililani Middle was the first multi-track school in the state, but will transition to a single-track curriculum next school year with the addition of the new building. Though the Blazers are a young school, they are the largest middle school in the State of Hawai'i, and this transition will now align with the established DOE school calendar, gaining an additional eleven more days of school. I was also fortunate to attend many of the elementary schools in celebrating their Aloha Assemblies and present certificates to students recognized as 2022 Kidani awardees. Graduation season is always an affirming time to reflect on the importance of our work in the Senate Education Committee to support our keiki throughout their educational journey. I do look forward to this time of year and these exciting steps for our students and their parents.

I would also like to take a moment to congratulate Keith Hayashi on being named the next Superintendent for the Department of Education. I have had the privilege of working with Keith since he was a Principal at Waipahu High School and am confident that he will bring the same transformative results for the State as he did for the students at Waipahu.

In closing, I'd like to wish our students and educators a wonderful end to their school year. My deepest aloha and congratulations to our Mililani High School graduating class of 2022! It was heartwarming to celebrate, in person, our graduates at the Stan Sheriff Center as we cheered on our seniors on this momentous occasion. After navigating the challenges of the last few years, it was especially inspiring to see friends, family and community members gather to celebrate the successes of these graduates, including 95 Valedictorians, 158 Summa Cum Laude, 107 Magna Cum Laude, 131 Cum Laude, 209 Academic Honors certificates, 266 Career and Technical Education honors certificates, 25 STEM honors certificates, 18 Seal of Biliteracy recipients, 7 AP Capstone Certificate & Diploma honors and over \$31 million in scholarship awards. In addition to these academic honors, the student-athletes also took home 29 OIA and HHSAA titles. The success of these students is a testament to their incredible resilience and dedication, as well as the collective support of their families, teachers and staff.

Congratulations Mililani High School class of 2022! Your hard work, tenacity and brilliance are invaluable qualities which will serve you well in your future pursuits. Best wishes in this exciting next chapter—we are all behind you!

Aloha friends and neighbors!

The 2022 Hawaii State Legislative Session has now adjourned. In the midst of the hustle and bustle at the capitol now that it has reopened and the excitement of community events allowing us to gather in person once more, I have been reflecting on my past 10 years in office. It is my honor and privilege to serve you in the State House. I am so proud of the accomplishments we have achieved so far, and I am so excited for the future. From the bottom of my heart, mahalo for working together with me for our community.

I recently attended the Mililani High School graduation ceremony at the Stan Sheriff Center at UH Manoa. My heart swelled with pride as I watched my High School Alma Mater celebrate the class of 2022 within the walls of my University Alma Mater. Can't wait to see what these students go on to do with their lives and how they will invest back in our community and our beautiful State of Hawaii.

One of my favorite things is to have both High School and College students join me in the office and community as interns. During this legislative session, we had one High School student (Keenan Yoshizawa, a Junior at Mililani High School) and one College student (Aiden Waldrep, a Sophomore at UH Manoa) join my office as interns. Both of these impressive young men were vital additions to our team this year and I cannot speak enough about how proud I am to see them succeed. It is students like them that make me so excited for our community and hopeful for the future of Hawaii.

If your child or someone you know is interested in an internship with my office, please encourage them to apply. Our Capitol internships are open to all High School Juniors and Seniors as well as College students of any level. The internship provides a unique opportunity to work with a legislator in the House of Representatives - giving students insight into our local legislative process and how we work to improve our community, district, and state. The Hawaii State Legislative Session takes place between January and May every year. Legislative Internships will begin on the first day of the Legislative Session in January and conclude in May. Summer and Year-round internships are also available for students who are interested. Many of you will be receiving my legislative session wrap-up newsletter in the mail if you haven't already. This newsletter will include updates on the bills that have passed this year, share constituent survey responses, and highlight community updates. In addition, I wanted to feature a few exciting highlights from my office this session.

I am happy to share that my bill HB2213 Relating to Mail Theft passed through the legislature and has been sent to the Governor's desk. Package theft has been an increasing issue in our state. In our presession survey of the district, crime was a top issue. HB2213 establishes the criminal offense of mail theft to provide a solution for the increased theft of packages left outside of residences and businesses from third-party carriers like UPS and FedEx. Other accomplishments this session from our area legislators include a great deal of funding Mililani Schools will receive for Capital Improvement Projects. Mililani High School, Mililani Waena, Mililani Uka, Mililani Ike, and Kipapa Elementary will all be receiving significant funding to make improvements and additions to school facilities and enhance their ability to invest in our keiki!

Aside from the policy work and capitol business, I have had the pleasure of participating in graffiti clean-up events, visiting classrooms to discuss the Hawaii State government, judging High School talent shows, and even teaching preschoolers how to jump rope. While I cannot say things are back to normal just yet, it is so nice to be headed in that direction.

Mahalo to everyone who participated in these community events with me, as well as all of you who filled out my community surveys and engaged in the legislative session by submitting testimony. Our democratic system would not be possible without the active participation of those in the communities we represent. # A Message From REPRESENTATIVE VALERIE OKIMOTO

Aloha Friends and Neighbors,

Thank you for the honor and privilege to serve as your voice and advocate in the state House of Representatives for my final term.

The 2022 Legislative Session adjourned Sine Die on Thursday, May 5th, 2022. We voted on over 300 final versions of bills, which were subsequently sent to Governor Ige; he has 45 days to review, approve or veto them. The deadline to veto bills is July 12th. Bills automatically become law without his signature after the 45th day.

Mililani is fortunate to have received over \$25 million this Legislative Session to improve facilities at our public schools. I am pleased to report that Mililani High School was awarded \$9.3 million for the Design and Construction for a Career and Technical Education facility and various grounds and site improvements. Mililani Waena Elementary school was also awarded \$7 million for cafeteria expansion, renovation of existing serving kitchen into administration space and other school improvements.


The Legislature's primary focus this session was to spend the surplus of more than \$2 billion. Most notably, the Legislature voted unanimously to give the state Department of Hawaiian Homelands \$600 million, which has until 2025 to spend, and stashed away \$500 million extra in the State's Rainy-Day Fund. The Legislature also cleared \$328 million to settle a decades-old case involving homesteaders and allocated \$64 million to the OHA. A \$300 million proposal to fund more affordable housing projects also cleared the Legislature, as did a \$250 million bill to give tax rebates of up to \$300 to Hawaii residents.

There were several bills that I voted against that would increase the cost of living. I also introduced bills to lower the cost of living here, such as a GET exemption for store bought goods and a moratorium on the barrel tax. I voted against bills that sought to make it burdensome and more dangerous for law enforcement officers to do their jobs and voted down measures that contribute specifically to the soaring construction costs in the State.

Perhaps the most impactful bill regarding our local economy, HB 2510, passed this Legislative Session. It will raise the minimum wage to \$12 an hour in October of this year. Wages would then rise to \$14 an hour in 2024; \$16 an hour in 2026; and \$18 an hour in 2028

During my time at the State Legislature, I have advocated for our local businesses and fought for ways to protect them and local jobs. While I saw how this bill would negatively impact them as they still recover from the impacts of COVID-19, I also recognized positives of a refundable Earned Income

**District News: Improving Our Schools** 

I am proud to announce that our community will receive over \$29 Million in building projects for our schools and community infrastructure. These projects are vital to support our children's education, our families' safety, and maintaining the special beauty of our Central Oahu communities.

• Mililani High School- Softball Field Improvements \$2,000,000

- Mililani High School- Admin Building Expansion \$3,500,000
- Mililani High School- Building the Career and Technical Educational Facility \$9,300,000
- •Mililani Uka Elementary- ADA Improvements \$1.000.000
- Mililani Waena Elementary- Cafeteria Expansion \$7,000,000
- Kamehameha Highway- Sidewalk improvements from Meheula Parkway to Lanikuhana Ave \$7,000,000

Total State Budget Funds to the Mililani Community: \$29,800,000

I am pleased that the Legislature and the State of Hawaii will be reinvesting over \$29 Million in our Mililani community. I will continue to represent our community and schools to include additional maintenance projects like these in our State Budget.

#### Rep. Yamane's Legislative Accomplishments

I am happy to share with our community the many improvements and bills that passed this year, which I was fortunate to achieve while serving as the Chairman of the House Health, Human Service, and Homelessness Committee:

- HB 1893- Daniel K. Akaka Veterans Home, a bill I introduced and championed that successfully passed the Legislature that allows the new Daniel K. Akaka State Veterans Home to open upon completion.
- HB 1980- Telephonic Services, a bill my office vigorously worked on and championed that successfully passed the Legislature which allows telephone behavior health services to be covered.
- HB 1932- Case Management Software, a bill my office vigorously worked on and championed that successfully passed the Legislature that requires the Department of Human Services' Child Welfare Service Branch to develop an innovative case management software solution.
- HB 1798- The Queen's Health Systems, a bill my office vigorously worked on that authorizes bonds to improve and expand the Queens Medical Center.
- HB 1894- Water Cremation, a bill I introduced that accommodates the use of new Native Hawaiian burial practices.
- HB 1575- Physician's Assistant, a bill I introduced to expand the scope of practice for physician assistants.
- HB 1758- Nurses, a bill I introduced that allows registered nurses and licensed practical nurses from a territory or foreign country to be issued temporary permits.

# A Message From COUNCILMEMBER HEIDI TSUNEYOSHI

Aloha,

Mahalo to the Mililani Town Association for the opportunity to provide a City Council legislative update. It has been my honor to serve the residents of Mililani Mauka for the last four years. I am grateful for the time I have spent advocating for improvements in Mililani and Mililani Mauka and hope to continue working with the community in the future.

My past legislative updates have expressed my concern with the spending on the rail project and continue to hold those concerns. However, with the refreshed Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation (HART) Recovery Plan that is being submitted to the Federal Transportation Administration, HART is removing the Pearl Highlands Park-and-Ride Facility, which is very troubling. While recovery plan projects the removal will have a low impact to ridership, the park-and-ride heavily incentivizes Central Oahu riders to use the rail system. In order to ensure that the park-and-ride continues to be priority, I introduced a resolution urging HART to look for future funding to construct the promised facility to allow Central Oahu residents better access to the long-awaited transit project. For more than a decade, the park-and-ride has had the support of residents, HART, the HART Board, City administration and the City Council. Removing it at this juncture is irresponsible and my hope is that HART makes it a priority when they look for future

In 2019, construction on the Mililani Mauka Middle School's new classroom building broke ground to address ongoing capacity issues and the school's transition to a single-track system. I am incredibly happy and grateful that after a quick two years, the building has been fully constructed. This is a great example of State and City collaborating for the betterment of the people and keiki we represent. Students and parents will be able to enjoy all the benefits of being on single-track system and the school will be able to accommodate its entire student body on campus at the same time.

The Mililani Mauka Park-and-Ride parking lot was repaved and repainted/restriped in February 2022. The bike shelter at the park-and-ride has been opened for use. Currently, the shelter is free to use, but will eventually have a smartcard locking system installed. No timeframe has been provided for when the transition to a paid system will begin, but I am very appreciative that the park-and-ride is becoming a multi-faceted facility with the ablity to accommodate residents with varied transportation needs.

My office has had a very good working relationship with the Wahiawa Community Policing Team (CPT) for many years. Through this connection we have been able to coordinate successful community projects in Mililani and Wahiawa. Most recently, we have been able to participate in cleanups around Mililani as part of the City's Malama O Ka Aina Community Program. The first cleanup took place in the areas surrounding Mililani High School where we removed litter and graffiti. A second cleanup was held at Michael S. Nakamura Neighborhood Park in April 2022 with another cleanup scheduled for May. Regular monthly cleanups are being planned to continue to help beautify the Mililani community.

In Wahiawa, the area around Karsten-Thot Bridge has been inundated with homeless encampments

for many years. In order to assist and help homeless individuals with transitioning to permanent housing and services, the City brought its Homeless Outreach and Navigation for Unsheltered Persons (HONU) program to Whitmore Village. The HONU program provides 24/7 short-term shelter services and navigation to connect homeless individuals and families to longer-term shelter. To supplement this effort, my office with Senator Donovan Dela Cruz's office coordinated to provide outreach to the encampments around Karsten-Thot Bridge. Following the outreach, our offices worked with HPD, State Department of Transportation, Achieve Zero, Dole, and the Office of Hawaiian Affairs to conduct a three-day cleanup which removed over 50 tons of debris and assisted individuals in transitioning to the HONU site where they could begin their journey to more stable housing.

# A Message From COUNCILMEMBER AUGIE TULBA

Aloha!

I hope you and your family are enjoying your summer. So far, 2022 has been a busy year at the Honolulu City Council. Here's an update on City issues that impact residents of District 9, which includes Mililani Town.

Reapportionment Changes the Face of District 9

The new Honolulu Council district lines were finalized by the 2021 Council Reappointment Commission and as a result, the boundaries for each of the nine Honolulu Council districts will change in the upcoming 2022 Election. I've been privileged to represent Miliani Town since entering office in January 2021, but sadly that will be coming to an end in January 2023.

Currently, Council District 9 includes Waikele, Village Park, Royal Kunia, Mililani Town, West Loch, Iroquois Point, Ewa Villages, and Ewa Beach. When the 2022 Elections take place, District 9 will no longer include Waikele, Village Park, Royal Kunia, and Mililani Town. Instead, the new district lines will include larger portions of the Waipahu and Ewa communities.

In November, Mililani Town constituents will be part of District 8 and voters will once again vote for a new City Councilmember. The new District 8 areas will include Waimalu, Newtown, Pearl City, Seaview, Crestview, Waipio Gentry, Koa Ridge, Mililani Town, and Mililani Mauka.

Creating Opportunities for Local People

The pandemic proved how economically vulnerable we are in Hawaii. If we don't give people stable employment options, more young people and local families will seek opportunities in the mainland. This dilemma inspired Bill 45 (2021), a bill that introduced with Councilmember Carol Fukunaga, to help attract businesses, create more well-paying jobs, and diversify our economy. Specifically, the bill will encourage businesses in industries like

film, healthcare, manufacturing, technology, and cyber security that are located in Transit Oriented Development, or TOD areas, to invest in Hawaii through property tax rebates, permit fee waivers for construction and development, and eligibility for county grants. In exchange, qualifying businesses must commit to investing millions into our City and promise the creation of new jobs. My hope is to see the City Council pass and have the Mayor sign Bill 45 so we can start to finally diversify the local economy like we've talked about for decades.

The City Budget

My staff and I extensively reviewed the City Budget for the fiscal year July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023. In hopes to keep you more informed about the City's FY23 Budget, the Council put together the following website to help you navigate and learn about the budget and process: https://www.honolulucitycouncil.org/budget.

Honolulu Hale is Open!

Finally, some exciting news! After being closed to the public for many months because of the pandemic, the Honolulu City Council has reopened its doors to the public and is allowing both in-person and online testimony. I can't wait to see you at the Hale!

The MTA quarterly assessment is collected in accordance with Article VI, Section 6.02 of the Mililani Town DCCR. Assessment due dates are January 1st, April 1st, July 1st, and October 1st in the amount of \$145.00 per quarter (effective April 1, 2022). Quarterly reminder notices are sent to homeowners. A \$10.00 late fee will be charged if payment is not received by the 10th of the month that payment is due.



# TIPS FOR ENSURING A SAFE, ENJOYABLE WALK WITH YOUR DOG!

#### BE PREPARED

• Bring disposable waste bags and have water available for longer walking trips.



• Use proper equipment. To have tangible control over your dog, it is important to have a sturdy leash that is

4-6 feet long attached to a properly fitting collar or harness.

• If your furry friend is known to be curious or becomes easily agitated by other dogs or people,

consider the use of a mouth guard. The VCA animal hospitals suggests that the use of a mouth guard on a dog is known to help others, as well as the dog owner, feel more relaxed when used while on walks or to unfamiliar places. It can also help to prevent your dog from consuming unwanted objects.

#### BE SEEN AND HEARD

- When walking after dark, be sure to wear light, reflective clothing.
- Consider an LED collar, leash or harness so drivers and other walkers can safely spot you and your pooch

#### **BE PRESENT**

- Do your best to set aside the ear buds and keeping your cellphone in your pocket.
- The less distractions present can make for a more fun, relaxing experience, and allows you to be aware of your surroundings.

#### BE KNOWLEDGEABLE

- Take the time to educate yourself on potential hazards along your walking route.
- If you come across an unleashed and/or aggressive dog, please analyze the situation and act cautiously. Contact emergency services if you feel that the situation is unsafe or dangerous.
- According to the VCA animal hospitals, some dogs resort to aggressive behaviors in order to prevent strangers or even family members from getting too close to their owners. It is suggested to not suddenly approach a dog without permission from the pet's owner.
